



Agios Stefanos Beach

Small beach, good for swimming and protected from the winds. There's a handful of restaurants and beach clubs, including **Limnios Taverno** with sunset views. Close to the New Port and well-connected to Mykonos Town by bus and Sea Bus.

Agios Sostis Beach

Prettiest beach on the north coast, long and wide with calm, crystal water. Above the beach is the legendary **Kiki's Tavern**. You'll need your own wheels to get here; a scooter or an ATV is best, since the road is steep in places.

Fokos Beach

Quiet, secluded beach with clear blue water. There are no tourist facilities, but the amazing **taverna** just off the beach is worth a trip in itself. No public transit.

Megali Ammos Beach

Nice sand and swimming but can be windy. It's a short walk from the Chora along a busy road with no sidewalk.

Ornos Beach

Beautiful, kid-friendly beach with calm, turquoise water and wonderful views. Good restaurants and handy bus connections to Mykonos Town.

Agios Ioannis Beach

One of the most beautiful beaches in Mykonos. Secluded, quiet, and narrow with two tavernas and direct buses to Mykonos Town during high season.

Psarou Beach

The most upscale beach on Mykonos, dominated by the all-day beach club **Nammos** and a luxury mall.

Platis Gialos Beach

My favorite beach on Mykonos. Wide with lots of restaurants, a mini-market, direct buses to Mykonos Town, and a water taxi to Super Paradise and other beaches.

Agia Anna Beach 1

Low-key beach with an amazing restaurant, **Nikolas Taverna**, and a fun beach club, **Pinky Beach**. An easy walk from both Platis Gialos and Paraga.

Old Port Beach

Narrow beach with shallow water and good sand. There are no facilities, but it's only a short walk to restaurants, and there is usually a lifeguard on duty.

Elia Beach

The longest beach on Mykonos. Plenty of parking, 5 or 6 daily buses from Mykonos Town in high season, and a water taxi from Ornos and Platis Gialos. **Nudist area** at its secluded east end.

Agrari Beach

Very quiet and secluded with good sand and only one restaurant. No bus from Mykonos Town - bus to Elia, then walk 15 minutes. You'll want a rental car if you stay here.

Paradise Beach

Young, lively, party beach with many bars. After sunset, the party just gets crazier. Direct buses from Mykonos Town. Once the most popular gay beach, it's now largely straight.

Paraga Beach

Busy but beautiful with 3 beach clubs: the stylish **Scorpios**, luxurious **Sant'Anna**, and chilled out **Kalou**. Direct buses to Mykonos Town.

Super Paradise Beach

Small beach with lots of activity and a few beach bars. Regular buses from Mykonos Town, and small boat service from Platis Gialos and Paradise beaches. **The most gay-friendly beach.**

Lia Beach

Beautiful and quiet with great swimming and good snorkeling. No public transit. The small **La Luna taverna** has wonderful Greek and Italian food.

Kalafati Beach

Long, sandy-pebbly beach, not too crowded. Plenty of water sports: snorkeling, swimming, windsurfing, and jet skiing. Buses from Mykonos Town pass through **Ano Mera**.

Agia Anna Beach 2

Wonderfully uncrowded beach with some traditional seafood tavernas and sunbeds to rent. Excellent sand, great swimming, and views of **Naxos**. No direct bus from Mykonos Town.

Kalo Livadi Beach

Long, wide, sand-and-pebble beach that avoids the summer crowds. Several daily buses (all passing through **Ano Mera** village) in high season but no water taxis. A few seafront tavernas and several clusters of sun loungers.
